The Annual General Meeting of the Calgary Pensioner's Association was held in the Ogden Club Rooms on January 13 2015. The meeting was well attended with 42 members in attendance.

The meeting was opened by President Surinder Rehill at 10:30 A.M. who welcomed all the members. Surinder called for 1 minute of silence in memory of our deceased members of the past year. He then mentioned some of the upcoming programs and presenters for future meetings. In order to save time the minutes were not read but were accepted as printed. Surinder also introduced our new Temporary Secretary Treasurer Frank Mark.

#### **REPORT OF COMMITTEES ;**

<u>FINANCIAL COMMITTEE -</u> Frank Mark reported that the finances of the Association were in good shape with our Net Worth being \$14,834 28.

INTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS - Surinder Rehill reported on communication from Robert Cameron our Pensioner Representative about our new pension rate increase of \$12.75 per month that will show up on the January pension payment. He also mentioned that Blue Cross will go to direct billing starting February 1 2015 . You will now be required to present your Blue Cross I.D. card when ordering prescriptions . All members will be notified by mail on this change.

<u>SICK AND VISITING-</u> John Sparks reported on his visitations to our members in Nursing Homes and Hospitals .If you know of any of our members who would like a visit, please let John know,

<u>TRAVEL COMMITTEE</u> - Ken brown reported on our bus tours and although we had some successful events we are still not getting sufficient turnouts to ensure successful tours and some have had to be cancelled. Members will be notified of upcoming tours.

<u>SOCIAL COMMITTEE</u> - Pat Brown reported on our successful meetings when we hosted meals for 339 members through 2014, Pat thanked all the helpers in the kitchen for making these events successful.

<u>NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE-</u> Bill Benner reported on the costs of producing the Spring and Fall Newsletter . . We always produce 200 copies for each edition , but it was decided to reduce each edition by 50 copies to reduce costs and because of declining memberships.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS -</u> Dinah Breu thanked all the phoners and notified the members to let us know of any changes in E-mail addresses or phone numbers . We are still doing 107 phone calls and 170 E-mails .We would still like to get as

many E-MAIL addresses as possible because it makes it so much easier and cheaper for us to communicate with our members.

<u>MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE=</u> Frank Mark reported that we had 318 members at the start of 2014 and now we are down to 286 at the end of December 2014 .Frank reported that we had 25 members over 90 years of age. Membership is slowly declining as our members age.

<u>BYLAWS</u> Bill Benner presented one By-law revision regarding the Audit Committee. The proposed change was to reduce the Audit Committee from three members to two members in the event that it was not possible to get three members .This would be up to the discretion of the Board of Directors. At present we have three Auditors. Motion carried,

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CP. PENSIONERS= Lyle Berge reported on the National Council mentioning the pension increase of \$12.75 per month. Lyle also mentioned that Blue Cross payments increasing from \$16.58 a month to \$24.32 a month. There will be a convention this May in Montreal and our representatives will be making proposals to improve pensioners benefits. Lyle also mentioned that our Momentum magazine has been cancelled but we requested that the obituaries be published on the internet site.
